Simple energy saving measures can be fitted, advice on how to use heating controls better, checks for the cheapest energy tariff, and referrals for other help or improvements (eg. a new boiler, if eligible). Open to all types of householders - homeowners, private renters and social housing tenants.

Cascading Leadership | Supporting peer-to-peer leadership development

FREE [King's Fund opportunity](#) offers free support, advice and training to the leaders of health and wellbeing charities based on a ground-breaking model of peer-to-peer support. All participants are from the VCS and those providing the support are supervised and trained by King's Fund senior staff. To date, the programme has supported 120 VCS leaders and is now offering a further 64 places.

In a challenging external environment for many VCS organisations, independent evaluation has shown that the programme can support organisations to tackle substantial challenges and develop the skills and confidence of leaders, whilst building cross-sector collaboration and peer support. Redevelopment of North Mid. A&E will increase capacity by up to 20% on completion in late December. The aim is that waiting areas, treatment rooms and clinical bays are equipped to help see patients faster. Evening and weekend GP appointments are available across Enfield. Phone your GP practice to book, or call 03 000 333 666 (8am-8pm daily).

Call 111 for urgent care or treatment - FREE call and callers can use a translator or video BSL interpreter. NHS 111 can arrange for you to speak with a doctor, nurse, emergency dentist or other healthcare professional, call you an ambulance if you need one, or book an appointment to see the best person to provide your treatment.

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The Autumn Budget

Mental health will receive an increase - up to £250m by 2023/24 intended to cover the cost of a suite of mental health crisis services including dedicated mental health support in every major A&E department, a 24/7 crises helpline and increased community services.

Other pledges included additional £240m in 2018/19 & £240m in 2019/20 for adult social care funding, intended to ease winter pressures on the NHS; an additional £55m in the remainder of this financial year for the Disabilities Facilities Grant; and £410m for both adults' and children's social care.

The Chancellor acknowledged problems, but said Universal Credit is "here to stay", with £1billion funding for the DWP to help ease the transition, in-work allowances & support for claimants repaying debts. Source | NAVCA newsletter (members only)

EVA Funding Guide

Culture Seeds | London Mayor Arts, Culture and Heritage projects

[Culture Seeds](#) provides £1,000 - £5,000 to support community-led cultural projects by grassroots organisations (annual turnover under £50,000). Priority projects will support people on lower incomes, and connect communities that lack access to cultural resources and funding. Read the Guidance Notes thoroughly to give yourself the best chance of being funded.

Deadline | 2 year rolling programme. Funding available until Spring 2020.

Creative People & Places

[Creative People and Places](#) (Arts Council England) fund focuses on supporting communities to access arts and cultural opportunities eg music, theatre, museums, dance, craft, visual arts, libraries, festivals, creative writing, things people do, make or watch. *You don't need to have worked with arts and culture before to get involved.*

The Wakeham Trust

[The Wakeham Trust](#) provides grants to help people rebuild their communities | neighbourhood projects, community arts projects, projects involving community service by young people, or projects set up by those who are socially excluded. Small projects preferred - often, but not always, start-ups, where an initial £125 to £2,500 can make a real difference. The best way to understand the kinds of projects they support is to look at their website.

Combating Loneliness | Barchester Foundation

£100 to £5,000 [to connect or re-connect people](#) with others in their local community. Applications that combat loneliness and enable people to be active and engaged will be the highest priority in 2018.

The Percy Bilton Charity - UK

[Up to £2000 capital expenditure](#) (furniture and equipment; building/refurbishment projects) for organisations assisting disadvantaged youth, people with disabilities, or over-60s may apply. Registered charities only.

Big Lottery Digital Fund

[The Digital Fund](#) is a new funding programme to support charities and community organisations who want to use digital tools and approaches to support people and communities, but is limited to groups with a minimum income of over £500,000. Applications are open until 3rd December 2018.

Please note | Following the announcement some organisations have questioned the fund due to the £500,000 income threshold, which rules out many small charities that would benefit from the funding. In response, the Big Lottery Fund has indicated that the fund will be extended in 2019, to address the needs of smaller organisations specifically, and has stated that National Lottery [Awards for All](#) is open to all and can provide funding to support digital activities. Website Grants

£18,000 grants to fund the redevelopment of websites, to ramp up online income and increase charitable impact. Nonprofits interested in a Charity Website Grant can apply via [the Transform Foundation's website](#) Charities of any size with the ambition to grow - or with a single project in mind - are warmly encouraged to get involved. The grant covers the bespoke strategy, design, build, training and launch of a new, mobile optimised website. Winners must cover ongoing support fees for a minimum of 12 months.
